



Nice Curves

A beautiful new home deserves similarly attractive surrounds that will enhance the architectural features and complement the overall design - so engaging a landscaping contractor is always a good idea.

And for Adrian Walsh of Tecscape, this project gave him the opportunity to work with the gentle curves which gave the home its design edge, incorporating them into the nib walls which form the structure of the front fence, and into the long side of the pool, which boasts feature upon feature, including a shaded structure which floats in the pool. Featuring recycled ironbark supports which echo those in the gate house, it's not hard to imagine slipping out of the water and onto the deck to enjoy being shaded from the sun while still experiencing the joy of being outdoors.





Feature plantings in the garden include sculptural pandanus, one of which even lives in a planter box in the pool ... but then, so do the bromeliads which add burnished purple tones to the area, enlivening it with the contrast. Along the wall, bamboo flourishes and provides a green background while effectively screening the neighbours' fence. The pool has been tiled with mixed blue glass mosaics which deliver a light blue effect - it's positively resort like.

As a multi-award winner, Adrian has brought all his years of experience to bear on this project, and the outcome is areas which integrate to create a cohesive and visually pleasing landscape; from the gatehouse to the pool house, from the plantings in and around the pool to those in the garden, lines of sight have not been and will not be compromised even as the garden grows.
